Key Truth: The Resurrection of Jesus Christ has practical implications for life now and the life to come.

The Resurrection is essential to our Salvation, and it has consequences in this life and in the life to come. Just as our choices today affect the choices we have tomorrow, it is also true that what we believe today has implications for our life tomorrow. How we treat the Resurrection of Jesus Christ – whether or not we believe God's Gospel – will affect our physical as well as spiritual lives for all eternity.

DISCUSS

Read **1 Corinthians 15:20-34** and discuss with the group a statement or concept that stood out to you or impacted you in the sermon on **"Implications of Christ's Resurrection."**

DIG IN

1. The Resurrection of Christ solves man's greatest Problem.

(1 Cor. 15:20-22)

Would you agree that death is man's greatest problem? Why or why not?

In what ways does Christ's resurrection solve that problem?

In what ways does Christ as the "firstfruits" (v. 20) of the resurrection hint at more to come?

Read 1 Corinthians 15:22: What are the implications of this truth for believers in Jesus Christ? What about unbelievers?

2. The Resurrection of Christ inaugurates an eternal Order.

(1 Cor. 15:23-28)

3. The Resurrection of Christ exposes theological Ignorance.

(1 Cor. 15:29-34)

In what ways is our "religious ritual" meaningless without the resurrection?

In what ways is our sacrificial service "wasted" without the resurrection?

In what ways are people ignorant of God (v. 34) who do not believe in the resurrection?
