MICHAEL HEALTH UPDATE: Michael finished his 4th and last chemo treatment on April 17, which had him feeling terribly for the Easter weekend, but we expected that. Then we left for an 11 day trip to St Louis for the National Christian Medical Dental Association Convention. We were blessed with visiting different prayer partners on the way and had a great conference, but Michael never felt really tops. Thankfully we were able to attend and make many connections for missions and His Glory!

We decided also to wait to report to all of you, our wonderful supporters, until after Michael had some further scans and saw his oncologist, whom he saw yesterday. Michael has been complaining of a lot more shortness of breath since he started chemo. The good news is that there are no other signs of cancer at this time. The bad news is that there seems to be some sort of other inflammation process going on in his lungs. So now, he has an appointment to see his pulmonologist in a couple of weeks (who sent him to the surgeon last year), to see if this is something temporary due to the chemo or something chronic that was also developing last year.

Michael says that his nausea and extreme fatigue are lessening since he's now about 5 weeks post chemo. He will be finishing his anti-TB meds too in a couple of weeks. (Since he was diagnosed with latent TB, the Infection Disease doctor didn't want him to go on chemo without treatment.) After Michael sees his pulmonologist, he will go back to the oncologist, and we will see the next steps.

He was appointed by the T. Legislation and has this designation for life. There appears to be a new "figure head" pres of T now. (We have to be vague for security reasons. Sorry!) The fighting in N. T is intensifying as rebels from the M community push down from other countries. Please continue to pray for safety for all of the team in both the north and the south. [We] are confident that He who began a good work [in us and all the Togolese] will continue it to completion until the day of Christ Jesus," (Phil 1:6, NIV). We are not discouraged.
